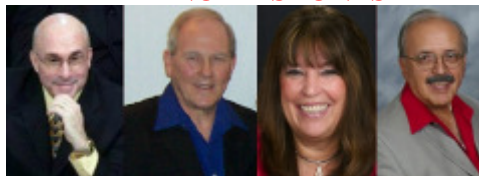

Saturday, October 11, 2014 – **RIDGE AVENUE QUARTET** is an Ambler based string quartet.

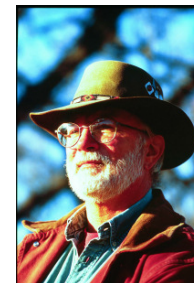

**PURPOSE** - The purpose of this outreach project is to provide high quality entertainment at a price (\$5) that is accessible to people in our greater community.

**STRUCTURE** - Each season we present a number of coffeehouses with varied entertainment. In general, the types of music programs we have are:

Singer/Songwriter or Solo performer

American roots music (e.g. old time country music, bluegrass, blues, Cajun)

Music from other countries or cultures (e.g. South American, Celtic, Eastern European)

Classical
